Section: General Policies
Subject: Smoke Free Building Policy
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Since September 1, 1992, smoking has not been permitted in campus buildings.

In recognition of environmental tobacco smoke health risks, the University will provide as close to a smoke-free environment as practicable for its faculty, staff, students and visitors. The right of a non-smoker to protect his or her health and comfort will take precedence over another's desire to smoke.

The success of this policy depends upon the thoughtfulness, consideration, and cooperation of smokers and non-smokers. All faculty, staff, students and visitors share the responsibility for adhering to and enforcing the policy. Any concern should be brought to the attention of the individuals responsible for the operation of the University facility in question and/or the Supervisor responsible for the work area.

Following is a partial list of regulations referred to in [SPG 601.4](#).

- Smoking is prohibited in all University facilities including University vehicles.
- Smokers are expected to stay a reasonable distance from building entrances, in order not to interfere with access or the rights of others. In special circumstances, smoking may not be permitted at certain building entrances, which will be posted accordingly.
- Individuals who smoke on University premises will be responsible for the proper disposal of smoking products.
- The sale of tobacco products is prohibited on University premises.
