To recognize academic excellence, the University of Michigan-Dearborn will offer \$12 million in scholarships to Fall 2010 incoming freshmen. These four-year, merit-based scholarship offers will range from **\$8,000 to Full Tuition, estimated at \$36,000.**

**We made it easy!** Your application for admission is also your application for scholarship consideration. **Apply online by December 15, 2009** for priority scholarship consideration. Shortly after admission, we will notify you of your scholarship eligibility. If you are eligible for more than one **UM-Dearborn funded scholarship**, the scholarship of greater value will be awarded.

You may also be considered for various scholarships ranging from \$500 to Full Tuition.

Students are still eligible to receive the Chancellor's or Dean's scholarships as well as interview for one of the 12 Full Tuition Opportunity Scholarships list below.  Among the University of Michigan-Dearborn Opportunity Scholarship recipients, <b>12 students</b> will be selected to receive a renewable <b>Full Tuition and select fees scholarship</b> . All Opportunity Scholarship recipients admitted by January 15 will be invited to interview for the full tuition awards.
