**Bachelor of Business Administration Curriculum Guide for 2009-10**  
**FOR STUDENTS TRANSFERRING TO UM-D PRIOR TO FALL 2010**

**The College of Business faculty has approved a new BBA curriculum effective Fall 2009 for incoming freshmen students and Fall 2010 for all transfer students. Some prerequisites and distribution requirements have changed. Those students who don't anticipate transferring prior to Fall 2010 should follow the new requirements. Admission directly into the BBA Program requires junior standing (55 credits or more) and completion of the specific requirements listed in this guide. Any student deficient in standing and/or the specific requirements can enter the University of Michigan – Dearborn's College of Business as a Pre-business student. Students do not have to complete all of the distribution requirements prior to transfer.

Students may declare a BBA with a concentration in Accounting (with tracks in Accounting Information Systems, Controllership, and Financial Accounting and Reporting); Finance; General Business (with track in Prelaw); Management; Information Technology Management; Marketing; Supply Chain Management; and Human Resource Management. Internships are available to all BBA students.

**SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS** (courses required prior to admission to the BBA Program)

- 1) Accounting ACCT 1080 and 1090.
- 2) Economics: ECON 1160 and 1170.
- 3) English Composition: ENGL 1180 and 1190 or ENGL 1210 and 1220.
- 4) Mathematics: MATH 1370 or 1760.
- 5) Management Information Systems: ITCS 1010.

**NOTES:** A maximum of 62 credit hours is accepted by the College of Business (grades of C- and below are not accepted). Students are encouraged to complete the mathematics sequence through Calculus I at the community college. **Students may complete the BBA Program requirements by attending part time in the evenings.** It is the student's responsibility to stay in yearly contact with the UM-D Admissions Office to stay abreast of any changes.

A GPA of **2.70** must be maintained in both the overall and specific requirements. Students also must have earned a total of 55 transferable credit hours in order to apply for admission directly into the BBA Program.

*"Admission to the College of Business is selective. On an average, students admitted to the College have a cumulative GPA of 3.20. Students with specific and cumulative GPA's above 2.70 have a higher probability of admission."*

## DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS

**ENGLISH COMPOSITION:** (6 hrs.) from ENGL 1180 and 1190 or 1210 and 1220.

**ART OR MUSIC HISTORY:** (3 hrs.) from ARTT 2610, 2620; HIST 2340; HUMN 1460; MUSC 1030, 2710, 2720.

**LETTERS:** (3 hrs.) from ENGL 1730,2510,2520,2600,2610,2710,2720,2730,2800,2810,2850; HUMN 1700, 1750,2000; PHIL 2010,2100,2400.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGE:** (8 hrs. of a 2-course sequence) from FREN, GRMN, ITAL, or SPAN 1260,1270,2360,2370.

A student may be exempted from the foreign language requirement by demonstrating college-level proficiency in an approved foreign language. Such proficiency may be shown in one of three ways:

1. By presenting three years of high school work in a foreign language with a grade of C or better in the last semester.
2. By passing a written and oral proficiency exam.
3. By completing a one-semester language course at the 102 level or higher in the chosen language with a passing grade.
4. Note that demonstrating proficiency does not grant credit for courses not taken. Students exempt from the foreign language requirement must fulfill the 4-8 credit hours in non-professional electives.

**BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE:** (15 hrs. with at least one course chosen from each group

**NOTE: ECON 1160+1170 are required for admission to the BBA Program** and can be counted as part of the 15 hrs. required):

**Group A:** ANTH 1000, 2220; INTL 2000; PSYC 1010, 2160, 2220, 2400, 2450, 2600, 2750, 2800; SOCY 1010, 1100, 2450.

**Group B:** ECON 1160, 1170; POLS 1000,1200,1600,1900,1950; SOSC 2010.

**HISTORY:** (3 hrs.) from HIST 1260,1270,1500,1600,1700,2100,2200,2360,2390,2420,2520,2650; INTL 2010,2300,2500,2700.

**MATHEMATICS:** (4 hrs.) from MATH 1370 or 1760.

**BIOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE:** (7/8 hrs. with one course containing a lab):

ASTR 1030,1040; BIOL 1000,1010,2110,2310,2400,2710,2730;

CHEM 1050,1060,1170,1180,2260,2270,2280; ENV5 1050; GEOL 1140,1150; NATS 1200,1210,1310;

PHSA 1050; PHYS 1180,1190,2200,2230,2400.
