**Bachelor of Business Administration Curriculum Guide**  
**FOR STUDENTS PLANNING TO TRANSFER TO UM-D FALL 2010 AND LATER**

The School of Management faculty has approved a new BBA curriculum effective Fall 2009 for incoming freshmen and Fall 2010 for all transfer students. Some prerequisites and distribution requirements have changed. The changes are reflected on this transfer guide. Admission directly into the B.B.A. Program requires junior standing (55 credits or more) and completion of the specific requirements listed in this guide. Any student deficient in standing and/or the specific requirements can enter the University of Michigan – Dearborn’s School of Management as a Pre-business student. Students do not have to complete all of the distribution requirements prior to transfer.

Students may declare a B.B.A. with a concentration in Accounting (with tracks in Accounting Information Systems, Controllership, and Financial Accounting and Reporting); Finance; General Business (with an optional track in Prelaw); Management; Information Technology Management; Marketing; Supply Chain Management; and Human Resource Management. Internships are available to all BBA students.

**DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS**

**ENGLISH COMPOSITION:** (6 hrs.) from ENG 1510, and 1520 or 2200.

**ART or MUSIC HISTORY:** (3 hrs.) from ART 1560,1700,2560,2600,2620; HUM 1900; MUS 1540,1550,1560,1585, 1590,1600,1685.

**LETTERS:** (3 hrs.) from ENG 1610,1710,1720,2300,2510,2520,2530,2540,2550,2560,2750,2760,2770; HUM 1710; PHI 1510,1520,1610; BIO 1580.

**BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE:** (5 courses) with at least one course chosen from each group;

**NOTE:** ECO 2610 and 2620 are required for admission to the BBA Program and can be counted as part of the 15 hrs. required):

**GROUP A:** ANT 1520,1540,2510,2750; GRN 2550; PSY 1510,2510,2630,2730, 2830, 2910; SSC 2610; SOC 2510,2520,2530,2550.

**GROUP B:** ECO 2610,2620; POL 1510,2520,2530,2610.

**HISTORY:** (3 hrs.) from HIS 1510,1520,1550,1700,2510,2520,2610,2620.

**MATHEMATICS:** (4 hrs.) from MAT 1600 or 1730.

**BIOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE:** (7-8 hrs. with one course containing a lab):

BIO 1320,1500,1511,1530,1560,,2510,2540,2550,2560,2630,2640,2710,2810,2830,2840;

CHE 1000,1320,1510,1520, 2610,2620,2650; FSN 1500; GSC 1530,1580,1590,1620;

**CRITICAL THINKING/LOGIC:** (3 hrs.) from PHI 1710.

**INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS:** (4 hrs.) from BUS 1100.

**SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS** (courses required prior to admission to the BBA Program)

- 1) Accounting: ACC 1810 and 1820.
- 2) Economics: ECO 2610 and 2620.
- 3) English Composition: ENG 1510, and 1520 or 2200.
- 4) Mathematics: MAT 1600 or 1730.
- 5) Introduction to Business: BUS 1100.

NOTES: A maximum of 62 credit hours is accepted by the School of Management (grades of C- and below are not accepted). Students are encouraged to complete the mathematics sequence through Calculus I at the community college. **Students may complete the BBA Program requirements by attending part time in the evenings.** It is the student's responsibility to stay in yearly contact with the UM-D Admissions Office to stay abreast with any changes.

A GPA of **2.70** must be maintained in both the overall and specific requirements. Students also must have earned a total of 55 transferable credit hours in order to apply for admission directly into the B.B.A. Program.

*"Admission to the School of Management is selective. On an average, students admitted to the School have a cumulative GPA of 3.20. Students with specific and cumulative GPA's above 2.70 have a higher probability of admission."*
