



## Information for Recent High School Graduates Who Wish to be Summer-Term Guest Students at the University of Michigan–Dearborn

This information pertains to students who wish to attend Summer II term courses at the University of Michigan–Dearborn (July–August) following their graduation from high school but before their attendance at another institution in the fall term. **Admission under this status is for the Summer II term only.** Please read the following instructions carefully. If you have questions, please contact the Office of Admissions and Orientation, 313-593-5100.

### Admission

1. Complete the application.
2. Submit an official copy of your high school transcript, which must include SAT or ACT scores.
3. Provide proof of admission to another institution for the fall term by submitting **one** of the following:
  - a. A copy of your admission letter **OR**
  - b. A copy of your fall registration **OR**
  - c. A statement on letterhead from the institution signed by a staff member of the Office of Admissions verifying admission for the fall term

You must receive advising from a UM–Dearborn admissions counselor before you can be admitted. You can make an appointment by calling the Office of Admissions and Orientation, 313-593-5100. If you can't schedule an appointment before the summer term begins, you should speak with an admissions counselor by phone about your plans.

### Admission requirements

To be admitted as a recent-high-school-graduate guest student, you must meet the regular standards for freshman admission to UM–Dearborn: a 3.0 recalculated GPA AND a composite score of at least 22 on the ACT or combined score of at least 1030 on the SAT.

### Registration procedures

As a guest student, you are not required to attend Orientation. You will receive registration information and materials in the mail after you have been admitted to the University. Class schedules are available before the start of each term in the Office of Registration and Records, 240 Student Services Center.

### Transferability of course work

The institution to which you are transferring your UM–Dearborn course work makes the decision as to whether any particular course will transfer. You should talk with the Office of Admissions at that institution before enrolling for UM–D classes to ensure the best possible result. UM–Dearborn does not guarantee the transferability of courses to other institutions. To transfer classes to your primary institution, you will have to arrange for a transcript of any credit earned as a guest student to be sent to your primary institution. You may do this in the Office of Registration and Records, 240 Student Services Center.

If you answered “yes” to the question “Are you a resident of Michigan?” and any of the following circumstances apply to you, you may be required to file an Application for Resident Classification and be approved to qualify for in-state tuition:

- You currently live outside the state of Michigan for any purpose, including, but not limited to, education, volunteer activities, military service, travel, and employment.
- You have attended or graduated from a college outside the state of Michigan.
- You have been employed or domiciled outside the state of Michigan within the last three years.
- You are not a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident Alien (if you’re a Permanent Resident Alien, you must have a Permanent Resident Alien card).
- Your spouse/partner or parent is in Michigan as a nonresident student, medical resident, fellow, or for military assignment or other temporary employment.
- You are 24 years of age or younger and a parent lives outside the state of Michigan.
- You are 24 years of age or younger and have attended or graduated from a high school outside the state of Michigan.
- You have attended or graduated from an out-of-state high school and have been involved in educational pursuits for the majority of time since high school graduation.
- You previously attended any University of Michigan campus (Ann Arbor, Dearborn, or Flint) as a nonresident.

Other circumstances may also require you to file a residency application.

**Filing deadlines for residency** are September 30 for Fall Term, January 31 for Winter Term, and July 31 for all Spring/Summer Terms.
