Bachelor of Business Administration Curriculum Guide
FOR STUDENTS PLANNING TO TRANSFER TO UM-D FALL 2010 AND LATER

The College of Business faculty has approved a new BBA curriculum effective Fall 2009 for incoming freshmen students and Fall 2010 for all transfer students. Some prerequisites and distribution requirements have changed. The changes are reflected on this transfer guide. Transfer students with questions regarding the change may contact Susan Wells at swells@umich.edu.

Admission directly into the BBA Program requires junior standing (55 credits or more) and completion of the specific requirements listed in this guide. Any student deficient in standing and/or the specific requirements can enter the University of Michigan – Dearborn’s College of Business as a Pre-business student. Students do not have to complete all of the distribution requirements prior to transfer.

Students may declare a BBA with a concentration in Accounting; Finance; General Business (with a track in Prelaw); Management; Information Technology Management; Marketing; Supply Chain Management; and Human Resource Management. Internships are available to all BBA students.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS (courses required prior to admission to the BBA Program)

- 1) Accounting: ACC 111 and 122
- 2) Economics: ECO 211 and 222
- 3) English Composition: ENG 111 and 226
- 4) Mathematics: MTH 182 or 191
- 5) Introduction to Business: BMG 140

NOTES: A maximum of 62 credit hours is accepted by the College of Business (grades of C- and below are not accepted). Students are encouraged to complete the mathematics sequence through Calculus I at the community college. **Students may complete the BBA Program requirements by attending part time in the evenings.** It is the student's responsibility to stay in yearly contact with the UM-Dearborn Admissions Office to stay abreast of any changes.

A gpa of **2.70** must be maintained in both the overall and specific requirements. Students also must have earned a total of 55 transferable credit hours in order to apply for admission directly into the BBA Program.

"Admission to the College of Business is selective. On an average, students admitted to the College have a cumulative GPA of 3.20. Students with specific and cumulative GPA's above 2.70 have a higher probability of admission."

DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS

ENGLISH COMPOSITION: (6 hrs.) from ENG 111 and 226.

ART OR MUSIC HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from ART 130; HUM 101,102; MUS 180.

LETTERS: (3 hrs.) from ENG 140,160,170,181,200,211,212,213,214,222,223,224,281; HUM 145,146; PHIL 101, 200, 205, 240, 245.

BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE: (15 hrs. with at least one course chosen from each group;

NOTE: ECO 211 and 222 are required for admission to the BBA Program and can be counted as part of the 15 hrs. required):

Group A: ANT 201,202,205; PSY 100,150,206,207,209,210,232,257,260,273; SOC 100,205,207, 230,250.

Group B: ECO 211,222; PLS 112,150,211,220,250.

HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from HST 121,122,123,150,200,201,202,210,215,216,220,230,235,240,251,260,270.

MATHEMATICS: (4 hrs.) from MTH 182 or 191.

BIOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE: (7-8 hrs. with one course containing a lab): AST 111; BIO 101,102,103,107,111,200,208,212,215,220,227,228,237; CEM 105,111,122,140,211,222; GLG 100,104,114,125; PHY 105,111,122,211,222.

CRITICAL THINKING/LOGIC: (3 hrs.) PHL 250.

INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS: (3 hrs.) BMG 140.
