Bachelor of Business Administration Curriculum Guide 2008-09

Admission directly into the B.B.A. Program requires junior standing (55 credits or more) and completion of the specific requirements listed in this guide. Any student deficient in standing and/or the specific requirements can enter the University of Michigan – Dearborn’s School of Management as a Pre-business student. Students do not have to complete all of the distribution requirements prior to transfer.

Students may declare a B.B.A. with a concentration in Accounting (with tracks in Accounting Information Systems, Controllership, and Financial Accounting and Reporting); Finance; General Business; Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; Supply Chain Management; and Human Resource Management. Internships are available to all BBA students.

DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS

ENGLISH COMPOSITION: (6 hrs.) from ENG 111 and 226.

ART OR MUSIC HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from ART 130; HUM 101,102; MUS 180.

LETTERS: (3 hrs.) from ENG 140,160,170,181,200,211,212,213,214,222,223,224,281; HUM 145,146; PHIL 101, 102, 200, 205.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: (8 hrs. of a 2-course sequence) from FRN, SPN 111,122,213,224; GRM 111,122.

A student may be exempted from the foreign language requirement by demonstrating college-level proficiency in an approved foreign language. Such proficiency may be shown in one of three ways:

- By presenting three years of high school work in a foreign language with a grade of C or better in the last semester.
- By passing a written and oral proficiency exam.
- By completing a one-semester language course at the 102 level or higher in the chosen language with a passing grade.
- Note that demonstrating proficiency does not grant credit for courses not taken. Students exempt from the foreign language requirement must fulfill the 4-8 credit hours in non-professional electives.

BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE: (15 hrs. with at least one course chosen from each group;

NOTE: ECO 211 and 222 are required for admission to the BBA Program and can be counted as part of the 15 hrs. required):

Group A: ANT 201,202,205; PSY 100,150,206,207,209,210,232,257,260; SOC 100,205,207, 230,250.

Group B: ECO 211,222; PLS 112,150,211,220,250.

HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from HST 121,122,123,150,200,201,202,215,216,220,230,235,240,251,260,270.

MATHEMATICS: (4 hrs.) from MTH 182 or 191.

BIOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE: (7-8 hrs. with one course containing a lab): AST 111; BIO 101,102,103,107,111,200,208,212,215,220,227,228,237; CEM 105,111,122,140,211,222; GLG 100,104,114,125; PHY 105,111,122,211,222.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: (3 hrs.) CIS 110.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS (courses required prior to admission to the BBA Program)

- 1) Accounting: ACC 111 and 122
- 2) Economics: ECO 211 and 222
- 3) English Composition: ENG 111 and 226
- 4) Mathematics: MTH 182 or 191
- 5) Management Information Systems: CIS 110

NOTES: A maximum of 62 credit hours is accepted by the School of Management (grades of C- and below are not accepted). Students are encouraged to complete the mathematics sequence through Calculus I at the community college. **Students may complete the BBA Program requirements by attending part time in the evenings.** It is the student's responsibility to stay in yearly contact with the UM-Dearborn Admissions Office to stay abreast of any changes.

A gpa of **2.70** must be maintained in both the overall and specific requirements. Students also must have earned a total of 55 transferable credit hours in order to apply for admission directly into the B.B.A. Program.

"Admission to the School of Management is selective. On an average, students admitted to the School have a cumulative gpa of 3.20. Students with specific and cumulative gpa's above 2.70 have a higher probability of admission."
