Bachelor of Business Administration Curriculum Guide for 2009-10
FOR STUDENTS TRANSFERRING TO UM-D PRIOR TO FALL 2010

The College of Business faculty has approved a new BBA curriculum effective Fall 2009 for incoming freshmen students and Fall 2010 for all transfer students. Some prerequisites and distribution requirements have changed. Those students who don't anticipate transferring prior to Fall 2010 should follow the new requirements. Admission directly into the BBA Program requires junior standing (55 credits or more) and completion of the specific requirements listed in this guide. Any student deficient in standing and/or the specific requirements can enter the University of Michigan – Dearborn's College of Business as a Pre-business student. Students do not have to complete all of the distribution requirements prior to transfer.

Students may declare a BBA with a concentration in Accounting (with tracks in Accounting Information Systems, Controllorship, and Financial Accounting and Reporting); Finance; General Business (with a track in Prelaw); Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; Supply Chain Management, and Human Resource Management. Internships are available to all BBA students.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS (courses required prior to admission to the BBA Program)

- 1) Accounting ACC 110 and 111
- 2) Economics: ECO 101 and 102
- 3) English Composition: ENG 119 and 120
- 4) Mathematics: MAT 171
- 5) Management Information Systems: BUS 225 or CIS 110

Transfer students cannot receive credit for both BUS 225 and CIS 110.

NOTES: A maximum of 62 credit hours is accepted by the College of Business (grades of C- and below are not accepted). Students are encouraged to complete the mathematics sequence through Calculus I at the community college. **Students may complete the BBA Program requirements by attending part time in the evenings.** It is the student's responsibility to stay in yearly contact with the UM-Dearborn Admissions Office to stay up to date with any changes.

A GPA of **2.70** must be maintained in both the overall and specific requirements. Students also must have earned a total of 55 transferable credit hours in order to apply for admission directly into the BBA Program.

"Admission to the College of Business is selective. On an average, students admitted to the College have a cumulative GPA of 3.20. Students with specific and cumulative GPA's above 2.70 have a higher probability of admission".

DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS

ENGLISH COMPOSITION: (6 hrs.) from ENG 119 and 120. (Students are required to take an English Placement Exam at UM-Dearborn. For those students who do not place at the COMP 105 level, COMP 227 will be required).

ART OR MUSIC HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from HUM 211,212,221,222,231.

LETTERS: (3 hrs.) from ENG 212,228,231,232,233,234,240,250,252,260,261,266,290; PHL 101,102,201,221.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: (8 hrs. of a 2-course sequence) from ARA, FRE, JPN or SPA 101,102,201,202.

A student may be exempted from the foreign language requirement by demonstrating college-level proficiency in an approved foreign language. Such proficiency may be shown in one of three ways:

1. By presenting three years of high school work in a foreign language with a grade of C or better in the last semester.
2. By passing a written and oral proficiency exam.
3. By completing a one-semester language course at the 102 level or higher in the chosen language with a passing grade.
4. Note that demonstrating proficiency does not grant credit for courses not taken. Students exempt from the foreign language requirement must fulfill the 4-8 credit hours in non-professional electives.

BEHAVIORAL AND SOCIAL SCIENCE: (15 hrs. with at least one course chosen from each group;

NOTE: ECO 101,102 are required for admission to the BBA Program and can be counted as part of the 15 hrs. required):

Group A: ANT 152,153,154,201,210; PSY 101,202,220,250,260,270; SOC 100,103,104,230,245,250.

Group B: AAS 131; ECO 101,102, 272; PS 101,104,160.

HISTORY: (3 hrs.) from HIS 151,152,220,230,249,250,261,262; MWS 103,114.

MATHEMATICS: (4 hrs.) from MAT 171.

BIOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL SCIENCE: (7-8 hrs. with one course containing a lab):

AST 101; BIO 125,151,155,165,175,240,250,295; CHM 105,136,145,155,250,252,255; GEL 210;

PHY 115,235,245,265,275; PSC 110.

COMPUTER LITERACY: (3 hrs.) BUS 225 or CIS 110.
