Eligibility: All full-time faculty members. Former recipients are not eligible for a repeat award for a period of 10 years. Award winners of the past:

Criteria: The Distinguished Research Award will be made to faculty who have exhibited extraordinary scholarship, and who have consistently and with frequency published important works that enlarge the scope of human knowledge, or who consistently and with frequency have produced acclaimed creative works. In disciplines such as engineering and science, a distinguished record of external funding may be an important consideration. Although an award may be triggered in any given year by a major publication or creative project, Research Awards will normally be made in recognition of the faculty member's accomplishments over an extended period.

Awards: Up to two awards of \$3,000 each.

Nominations: Any member of the campus community.

Guidelines: Information should include:

- ◆ nomination form
- ◆ nomination letter
- ◆ nominee's current curriculum vita
- ◆ research statement from nominee
- ◆ two external letters of support from references familiar with the nominee's research
