Interaction with students outside the classroom, as a counselor, advisor, or group participant. Evidence of professional growth as a teacher. Commitment to undergraduate or graduate education.

Awards: \$3,000 award to each recipient.

Nominations: Any member of the campus community. Students and student groups are particularly encouraged to participate in the nominating process.

Guidelines: Information should include:

- ◆ Two letters of support from students
- ◆ Two letters of support from faculty

Subsequently: Teaching evaluations from the students will be requested by the Office of the Provost.
